



Sukkoth Campground Guidelines

Registration – ALL campers/guests are required to check in at the campground office to receive armbands and car passes, prior to coming to the campground area. Day guests are required to leave the campground by 11 p.m.

Modesty in the camp and during worship:

The issue of proper modesty before our brethren, and as we dance and worship before Yahweh is a very important topic. Scripture teaches us to walk “humbly” and “set-apart” before Yahweh, in our attitude, the intentions of our heart, and the way that we present ourselves before Him and to others. As Torah observant women, young ladies, and men, we have a responsibility to make sure that attention is not on any intimate parts of our bodies because we have not properly clothed ourselves in “humility”. For this reason, we are asking ALL who participate in the dance portion of worship to wear appropriate, modest apparel. To clarify this further, the following guidelines are implemented:

- NO shorts will be allowed during worship and no short-shorts allowed in the camp.
- NO tight or short skirts or dresses in the camp please (only loose-fitting skirts and dresses that fall below the knee).
- NO skin-tight, midriff, or cleavage-revealing shirts in the camp please (the upper torso should be modestly covered and concealed).
- NO skin-tight slacks or jeans in the camp please (something that covers the rear-end completely must be worn over any pants outfits that hug the skin).
- Men must wear shirts at all times please.

Please use discretion and inspiration

Pets:

- Pets are welcome in the campground.
- All pets must be leashed or in a confined area and attended by the owner.
- Please pick up after your pet by bringing a **pooper-scooper and bags** to place in proper receptacles.
- Anyone not adhering to these guidelines will be asked to remove their pet from the premises.

Camp Courtesy:

- Quiet time will be from 11 p.m. (12 pm on weekends) until 8 a.m.
- Quiet fellowship and worship are encouraged at campsites away from sleeping campers.
- Shofar trumpeting is welcome any time up until quiet hours. (Just because you can does not mean you have to!) Please refrain from blowing during quiet time.

Camp Security:

- There will be a security provided for Sukkoth at the campground.
- There will be first-aid station at the cook tent area.

All children 12 and under must be supervised by an adult.
